

5 Hidden Gem Boutique Hotels in Italy

Certain areas of Italy attract mobs who return year after year, but a slew of boutique hotels in lesser-known provinces are luring visitors with a hyperlocal charm of their own.

Su Gologone, Sardinia

The best feature of this hidden country mansion is the *agriturismo*-style restaurant, which serves meals of spit-roasted pig, sharp pecorino, and fried ravioli with honey, accompanied by Cannonau wine and myrtleberry liqueur.
